In the design process, I believe that the landscape architect's intervention is mostly driven by the pre-existing qualities and assets of the site. The landscape professional will then reveal, organise, and enhance them to deliver a project that grows better overtime.

I have extensive experience of all stages of the design process, from inception and design through to completion. Before joining Gustafson Porter + Bowman in 2018, I worked for Chris Churchman's award-winning CTF studio in London, as well as Dominique Perrault's Architectural practice in Paris, servicing private and public sector clients on projects in the education, residential, cultural, and commercial sectors for high profile projects such as the submission for the Paris Olympics 2024 or a large scale infrastructure in the UK.

Parallel to this, I practice as an artist, developing crafts through carving and prints, running workshops with adults and kids, exhibiting my work in galleries. I have also worked as a freelance Landscape Architect, involved in participatory and social projects that focus on emergency and temporary occupation of sites like Tempelhofer Feld in Berlin, sheltering war refugees.

SITE TOUR EIFFEL | Paris, France | 2018-

Winners of the City of Paris' Site Tour Eiffel Competition to reimagine the landscape of one of the world's most iconic monuments. Spanning an area of 54 hectares, the first phase of the project is to be completed by 2023 to be part of the City of Paris' show- case for Paris 2024 Summer Olympics.

The site is degraded after years of neglect. The area is prone to criminal activity. With tens of millions of visitors annually the green spaces are unable to regenerate.

The project does not solely focus on the Eiffel Tower. Rather, by planting green spaces, building promenades, and allowing pedestrian access to new and existing landmarks, the objective is to regenerate the entire area.

The challenge is to do this while addressing safety, security and environmental concerns for a large number of visitors. There are both public and private stakeholders with often conflicting political, socioeconomic, and commercial interests.

I was directly involved with the following areas of the project:

- Security, Safety & Risk Assessment (Integrated strategy Secured by design in a highly sensitive touristic area with Patrimonial Grade Protection)
- Hardscape, paving patterns and detailing, quality and reducing environmental impact
- Transportation coordination between public transports, bikes routes and private vehicles
- Mobility and accessibility (disabled access or visually impaired guiding supports or signages)

In addition, I was required to:

- Coordinate with sub-consultants, sub-contractors
- Manage teamwork collaborate in a bilingual team
- Monitor costs for materials / time
- Flag issues to higher management
- Gather requirements from client to plan deliverables
- Adhere to regulations eg. Historical protection, Blue-Green infrastructure, Black skies
- Keep the counting up to date for costing reviews and budget management
- Coordinate mock-ups and latest Rhino modelling

In 2018, a proposal was submitted and won after a year of competitive dialogue. Stage 2, 3 & 4 of the Design Development has been delivered to the Client. The Planning application will be submitted in September and Stage 5 detailed design has already begun.
